A VISIT FROM BOB BLANCATO (NANASP)

We had the honor of welcoming Bob Blancato, the executive director of the National Association of Nutrition and Aging Services Programs (NANASP), for a special visit!

As one of only three Virginia recipients of the prestigious NANASP 2024 Mid-Year Grant, Bob shared that "a special visit was in order." We are thrilled to have received this \$3,000 grant in support of our PSR Pet Love Program, dedicated to improving the health and well-being of older adults in our community.

Our Pet Love Program is tackling malnutrition and reducing the risk of alpha-gal syndrome by providing flea and tick prevention for pets in the homes of older adults. Since alpha-gal syndrome is spread by tick bites, keeping ticks off pets helps prevent them from entering homes and posing a risk to our seniors.

Bob commented that "it was the most unique application received," and we are proud that our innovative approach was recognized as well worthy of the funding.

Nikki Dean, Nutrition Program Coordinator, expressed the significance of this grant, stating, "Being able to provide flea and tick prevention for our PSR Pet Love Program clients is a game changer. Not only does it protect their beloved pets, but it also helps prevent the spread of alpha-gal syndrome in our area. This grant allows us to expand our efforts in keeping both our clients and their pets safe and healthy."

As an added bonus, Bob even brought a special surprise: a generous pet food donation to support the PSR Pet Love Program!
